Reference is made to the tender Published under this Notice.

Pursuant to *ITB Section B - Clause 2.1: Clarification and amendment of RFP Documents*, we hereby issue Clarification No. 1 for your attention.

1.	<p><b>As per RFP Document, Section A: Letter of Association, Clause 1, it is mentioned that;</b></p> <p>“Proof of Registration with Engineers Board of Kenya as Consultancy Firm is required to be submitted in the proposal”. Our Firm is registered in Kenya as Consultancy Firm in 2014 and also qualified as permanent Establishment (PE) after completion of 180 days in Kenya from other India which is equivalent Engineers Board of Kenya.</p>	<p>The Bidder is required to show proof of Registration with Engineers Board of Kenya as a consulting Firm.</p>
2.	<p><b>As per RFP Document, Section E: Scope of works, Clause 3.3 (xvi), it states that;</b></p> <p>“Maintenance of works during construction and during the defects liability period, which shall be 24 months”</p> <p><b>However, as per Section E: Logistics and Timing, Clause 5.2, it states that;</b></p> <p>“18 months (Defects Liability Period), the consultant will only be engaged as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 4 months for Resident Engineer (spread over the 12 months’ period)”</li></ul>	<p>The Defects Liability Period shall be 24 Months. However, the Consultant will only be engaged for 6 Months spread over the same period.</p>

3.	<p><b>As per the RFP Document, Section E: Phase 3- Services During the Maintenance Period, Clause 3.4.2, it states that;</b></p> <p>“One man-month input each is foreseen for the Resident Engineer, Materials Technologist, Draughtsman and a Site Inspector during the maintenance period which should be utilized on intermittent basis as deemed appropriate....”</p> <p>This does not tally with the man-months given in Section E, part 6.1 (page 58) for Resident Engineer, Senior surveyor, Senior Materials Technologist and road Inspectors considering that the construction period is twenty-four (24) months.</p>	<p>The allocated effective-Man Month is sufficient to cater for the Consultant Staff required during maintenance period.</p>
